The Sunday School Teachers at St. Mark Lutheran Church and Concordia Lutheran School, Islamabad Pakistan have done a simple, yet effective, evangelism effort to explain The Story of Salvation. Pastor Hannan explained the Passion Play and the message behind it, that all sinners are saved by the blood of Christ on the Cross of Calvary. As a simple explanation of the sins that Jesus took on the cross, sins were written on placards and the children hung them on Jesus' neck.

During the winter months, freezing temperatures, freezing rains and all the challenges of narrow streets, children still walk through the narrow streets to come to main roads to be picked up. We are very thankful for our brothers and sisters who donated this bus to us and we thank our staff who makes sure that the children are carried in and out of the bus safely.

The children who stay late are the ones whose parents are working far away and cannot come on time and we cannot drop them home unattended. Praying for more female teachers to stay late especially for the girls. But as a plus, this is also time to get extra help for their studies.

Miss Sana is a good teacher and a hardworking woman. After school, she helps Julie with after school activities and choir practice.

Music Update - Hymnal Translation

The focus for the spring of 2025 has been to translate and practice new hymns for Lent, the Easter and church general Roman year in Urdu. The process includes first a draft of the poetic lyrics, aligning the syllables with the



music, practicing with the praise team, and finally editing for proper meaning and syntax. The titles include 'Glory Be To Jesus', 'All Glory Laud and Honor', 'Hosanna Loud Hosanna', 'I Know That My Redeemer Lives', 'Christ The Lord is Risen Today', and 'What a Friend We Have in Jesus'. We also rejoice that 'A Mighty Fortress Is Our God' is complete after presenting a significant challenge to our team. We are in the process of recording it professionally and have received quite a number of invitations to sing at other churches in the area. What an opportunity to evangelize!





We thank God for Pastor Hannan's service at St. Mark Lutheran Church, and St. Paul (under the tent) Islamabad. He is truly a servant of God, who loves to serve.
